Scams and Cons

Share Purchase Fraud or Boiler Room Fraud, as commonly known, is yet another type of scam that you should be aware of and avoid.

This is a crime that is commonly targeted at men, aged 50 plus. Tele sellers invite customers to invest in shares that are duped, purchasing worthless or over priced stock in companies with little or no value.

The fraud is one of just a number of telemarketing type scams which accounts for losses of millions of pounds every year. These include prizes and sweepstake and lottery scams, work at home plans and pyramid selling, to name but a few.

In summary, cold calls are made to potential investors; high pressure telephone sales tactics are used and supported by glossy documents and well designed websites.

How to protect yourself:

Stop, think and be sceptical. Are you being offered something for nothing or something that is too good to be true?
